Overview

In this lesson you will:

- Learn what a riff is
- Play a simple single-string riff from TAB
- Combine riffs and chords in a musical way

What Is a Riff?

A riff is a short, memorable musical idea that repeats. Riffs are found in rock, blues, pop, metal – almost every style.

Single-String Riff Example

TAB:

E|-----

B|-----

G|-----

D|-----

A|--0--0--2--0--3-

E|-----

- Practice this slowly.
- Use all downstrokes at first.
- Listen for even timing between notes.

Two-Chord Song Fragment

Try using just Em and G:

- 1. Strum Em for 4 beats.
- 2. Switch to G for 4 beats.
- 3. Repeat.
- 4. Once comfortable, try adding the riff between chord sections.

Combining Riff and Chords

Example flow:

- Play the riff 2 times
- Strum Em \rightarrow G \rightarrow Em \rightarrow G
- Repeat the whole thing

You now have the building blocks of a simple "song form": riff + chords.

Practice Goals for Lesson 7

- Play at least one simple single-string riff from TAB.
- Switch between a riff and chords without totally losing the beat.
- Start to feel how riffs and chord progressions can fit together.
